



RELIGIOUS SYMBOLS

Mary is crowned with a crown with the fleur-de-lis, an ancient symbol which was used to symbolize purity and specifically the Blessed Virgin Mary. The fleur-de-lis was later adopted into many of the royal crowns as a way of connecting their sovereignty to the purity and sovereignty of Mary, Queen of Heavens and Angels. The blue on her robe reminds us of her status as virgin and white is the color of purity. Scripture tells us that Mother Mary was Jesus' first disciple and life-long protector of Jesus. She is crowned Queen of Heaven and Queen of Angels as well as Mother of the Church. Jesus is being held up and supported by her as he offers his blessing and love to the whole world.
